The basis of the specific teaching is the understanding of art in a broader cultural-historical as well as philosophical-aesthetic context. The department is devoted to a broad overview of the history of art in all its manifestations and periods, that is, up to the present day, as well as to a broad theoretical base of preparatory courses and courses that scientifically go beyond the basic framework of art history. Through lectures and active work in seminars, exercises, professional excursions at home and abroad, and the possibility of professional practice, future graduates specialize in specific areas in the field of art history. Particularly beneficial in this area are student internships in the field of monument care, which directly prepare graduates for the possibility of employment in this field.

The aim of teaching in the field of History and Theory of Art is the comprehensive preparation of the graduate of the university to be able to be professionally active in the sphere of art and culture in organizations and workplaces whose focus is determined by the needs of artistic and cultural development, the protection of cultural heritage, the development of artistic activity, research and active support of the educational process. 8. Spatial, material, and technical provision of the study programme and support The study programme is implemented in the building of the Faculty of Arts of the University of Trnava at Hornopotočna 23 in Trnava. The Department of History and Theory of Art has two departmental rooms for teachers, two lecture rooms with larger capacity and two seminar rooms for smaller groups.
