2. Graduate profile and learning objectives

Graduates of the PhD programme in Sociology are prepared to use the acquired knowledge and skills in a number of fields of work that require expertise, a critical approach to solving tasks or problems, and the application of analytical skills. The programme of study includes knowledge concerning the basic levels, subsystems and processes in society and its segments, as well as methodological approaches and methodological rules of sociological investigation of social reality. The study focuses on the acquisition of knowledge and skills related to sociological theory, the history of sociology and methods of sociological research, which are complemented by basic knowledge from ancillary and related disciplines. Supporting topics include: social micro- and macro-structures, social processes, history of sociological thought: classical and contemporary sociological theories, methods and techniques of sociological research, and sectoral sociological disciplines according to the focus of the dissertation.

The specific learning outcomes related to each subject are defined in the information sheets of each of the taught subjects and can be found as an attachment to the application for accreditation of the study programme or on the website of the Faculty of Arts of the University of Trnava.

Graduates of the study programme Theory and Methodology of Sociology (3rd degree) are prepared for interdisciplinary cooperation in solving scientific as well as social problems, they are ready to identify and analyse developments at the international level as well as within the European Union, they are able to provide explanations of broader social processes and changes in contemporary societies, as well as the impacts and consequences of these processes on people's everyday life. 8. Spatial, material, and technical provision of the study programme and support

List and characteristics of the study programme classrooms and their technical equipment with the assignment to learning outcomes and courses (laboratories, design and art studios, studios, workshops, interpreting booths, clinics, priest seminaries, science and technology parks, technology incubators, school enterprises, practice centers, training schools, classroomtraining facilities, sports halls, swimming pools, sports grounds).

In the teaching process we usually use:

- two seminar rooms with a capacity of 24 seats and one lecture room with a capacity of 54 seats
- in case the capacity utilization in the provision of courses requires it, we also have other rooms available at the Faculty of Arts of the University of Trnava in Trnava,
- for methodological subjects we use a computer room equipped with IBM SPSS software for quantitative data analysis and NVivo software for qualitative analysis

All these rooms have both traditional and modern material and technological equipment, which includes whiteboards, data projectors, laptops or desktops with Internet connection and intranet services (online catalogues, library systems, etc.), as well as technologies for projection of presentations, videos or recordings related to teaching.

The Department of Sociology also has a library where both classical and contemporary literature in the fields of sociology, humanities and cognitive sciences are available to teachers and students. The departmental administrator of this library is Mgr. Lenka Diener, PhD. (lenka.diener@truni.sk). Each of the lecturers uses his/her own desktop or laptop computer with a connection to a high-speed black and white or colour printer. The Department also has multifunctional devices, photocopiers and scanners. Students have copiers and computers for quick access to information, located in the faculty hallways.

Students also have access to the TU University Library study room and areas with lounge chairs for relaxation or independent study during free time.

Students can further benefit from: Zátvor Swimming Pool, OS Secondary Vocational School gym, BouldroFka climbing wall, Peter Pázmaň Student House gym. More information regarding the sports activities offered to students of the University of Trnava is available on the university website in the Sports Activities section.

The University Library of Trnava University is the central library of Trnava University (TU). It provides professional library and information activities, preserves and bibliographically registers qualifications, bibliographically registers the publishing activities of teachers, researchers and doctoral students of TU, provides library and information services to students, teachers and employees of TU as well as the professional public. It organizes professional events and provides information education. It develops relations with domestic and foreign partners, especially through the exchange of documents. Mutual relations between the library and its users are regulated by the Library and Lending Regulations of the University Library of the TU. The mission, basic tasks and organizational structure are defined by the Organizational Rules of the University Library TU.

The profile of the library corresponds to the focus of the study fields of the University of Trnava. The main focus is on library units in the field of social sciences, humanities and natural sciences. Print library units complement electronic information sources, accessible on the basis of TU IP addresses.

The Faculty of Arts and Philosophy of the TU in Trnava publishes study literature (scripts and textbooks) for students in both printed and electronic versions. A lot of materials are also published in MOODLE courses. This greatly facilitates their accessibility for students.

Psychological clinic of the Student Support Center TU

The psychological clinic provides counseling services, lectures, consultations and group programs for students focusing on personal development, communication skills, coping with difficult life situations (at school, in relationships, in the family environment), in solving personal problems, mental fragility, important decisions and life challenges. Psychological services are provided by the staff of the Department of Psychology FF TU.
